Antisemitism Event

March 16th, 6:30-8:30 pm

Carin Mrotz, Executive Director of Jewish Community Action and a MARCH member, will offer a powerful exploration of the intertwinings of Antisemitism and White Supremacy. Here's a description of the event:

As we watch this presidential election and political season unfold, those of us whose hearts yearn towards justice and shared liberation have reason to feel like we might be holding our breath. We also know that we are living in a time that invites us to build the skills, spiritual imagination, and fortitude we need to create vibrant and powerful social movements that are capable of shifting the political reality around us.

Over the past years, we have seem antisemitism shift from an implicit suspicion to a a source of explicit violence. We know that in the coming months, we will experience an intertwining of antisemitism, anti-Blackness, and Islamophobia, and that many of us will feel as if our communities are being pitted against one another.

We need an understanding of how antisemitism works, why it matters, and what we can do about it if we are going to build the solidarity we need to strengthen our movements and our relationships.
